

As most of you know, we moved to Guangzhou, China in July of this year. After a few months of transition, we couldn't be more thankful for this opportunity and are having the time of our lives. It all started a year ago December when we arrived in Foshan, China to visit Daniel, who had moved there two years prior to be a part of a mission team. By the end of our visit, we caught a vision of doing a one-year sabbatical. Much to our delight Jon Marc chose to join as well! We live in a two-bedroom apartment, on an island within Guangzhou (the 3<sup>rd</sup> largest city in China), which contains eight of the top universities in Southern China. Todd just finished teaching a semester of Human Resources Mgmt. to International Students at Southern China University of Technology, which he thoroughly enjoyed (see picture below). We both work together tutoring Chinese students, ages 5 – 10 in our apartment which has also been a lot of fun. Particularly, it's been great getting to know our kids' parents. Karen has become close friends with one of them, named "TT," who is the librarian at the Pharmaceutical university. She's taken Karen to two exhibitions of local disabled Chinese artists. At the first one, the artist, who has no use of his arms, painted beautiful calligraphy using only his mouth in Chinese characters, and personalized it by adding Karen's Chinese name, 蕭碧燕, and presented it to her (picture below). After the second exhibition, another famous artist brought Karen and TT to his studio where he painted her portrait (picture below). He's a prestigious artist who at one time earned the prize of best painter in all of China!

However, the absolute greatest blessing of being here has unquestionably been the new relationships. We have taught numerous English corner classes for Chinese students (picture below) and gotten to know many of them quite well. We've also drawn very close to the Christians here, both Chinese and Western who live incredibly inspiring lives.

China is a beautiful country and we've been so fortunate to take trips to the mountains of Huangshan (picture below) and Hong Kong. We're also grateful for amazing excursions to Vietnam with some friends from China and Hawaii to see our friends the Miyashiro's and Roberson's.

Daniel and Sofia volunteered to move from Foshan to be on the latest mission team planting to Dongguan, China in August of this year (see picture below of the official sendoff of the team at the 30<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Hong Kong Church of Christ). Daniel has been going to school for intense language learning, initially in both Cantonese and Mandarin, and now just focusing on Mandarin, to add to his already solid foundation. He also teaches other English teachers and his own students at a local school. Jon Marc lived with us for the first couple of months but has since acquired his own place and teaches English at various locations around the city. His kids love him so dearly and attempt to tackle him frequently. He's dating a great girl named Irina from Russia and is busy exploring China.

We'll be returning to our home, jobs, family and friends in Atlanta in July, 2018 which we look forward to but already know that we'll be leaving a big chunk of our hearts here, as we did when we left each of you back home.
